Congratulations to the Class of 2022 for reaching the next milestone in education! Of the past few cohorts, this one has been hit the worst by the disruptions brought on by COVID-19. They faced the Circuit Breaker when they were in Sec 2, and together with teachers, had to grapple with Full Home-Based Learning for the first time in Singapore's education history. And again when they were in Sec 3, school routines were disrupted when the Ministry announced school closure and changes in their examination schedule. On top of those, CCA experiences were also compromised with Safe Management Measures tightened over this period.



Even with all these challenges, our students persevered including the almost 20 students who achieved 7 to 9 O-Level distinctions! More than half of our N(A)-Level students are eligible for the Polytechnic Foundation Programme, the best over the past five years. This cohort definitely showed grit and perseverance and pulled through to work toward their post-secondary aspirations. Hence, on the day the results were released, we celebrated with them for their efforts and focus in the national examinations. All the best to the Class of 2022 for your future endeavours!

Assessment Policy

Weighted Assessments (WAs) may take the form of written class tests, online assignments, projects and practical tests. To manage our students' overall assessment load, we will take care not to schedule more than two WAs on any given day.

We encourage our students to revise their work more regularly throughout the year and aim for thorough understanding of the concepts and information rather than put in last-minute effort just before the examinations or WAs. The assessment plan for 2023 is as follows:

Attire and Grooming

Q: This being the start of a brand new academic year, we welcome some words of wisdom from our Principal. What is some advice you might have for us?


